

Consideration of Appointment of New and Replacement Members to the Advisory Committee on Licensure, Eligibility, and Discipline

Background: At its January 2017 meeting, the Board issued a charge to its Advisory Committee on Licensure, Eligibility and Discipline (Committee) to review the Board's rules regarding unprofessional conduct and criminal conduct, including its Guidelines, and make recommendations for amendments, if necessary. The Committee's review should also include a review of the Board's unprofessional conduct rule, specifically as it relates to criminal conduct.

The Advisory Committee has not met since approximately June 2015. As a result, the Committee's membership needs to be amended to allow for two replacement members and two new members. 22 Tex. Admin. Code §211.6(f)(2) permits the Board to amend committee memberships as needed.

The two proposed replacement members are as follows:

1. Marjorie L. (Gie) Archer, MS, RN, CNE, to represent the Texas Association of Vocational Nurse Educators (TAVNE), replacing Betty Sims, RN, MSN, EdD, FRE; and
