Summary of Request: Consider approval of the Board's 2019 Rule Review Plan.

Background: The Government Code § 2001.039 (Administrative Procedure Act) requires a state agency to review each of its rules every four years following the rule's initial effective date to determine if the reasons for originally adopting the rule continue to exist. The agency must then consider whether to re-adopt, re-adopt with amendments, or repeal each rule.

Attached hereto as Attachment "A" is Staff's proposed 2019 rule review plan. The Board's previous plan, approved in 2015, was completed. The attached rule review plan continues the timeline established by the Board's previous rule review plans.

Staff Recommendation: Move to approve and implement the Board's 2019 Rule Review Plan as set out in Attachment "A".

- Chapter 217. Licensure, Peer Assistance and Practice. (July 2019)
- Chapter 219. Advanced Practice Nurse Education. (July 2019)
- Chapter 220. Nurse Licensure Compact. (October 2019)
- Chapter 221. Advanced Practice Nurses. (April 2020)
- Chapter 222. Advanced Practice Registered Nurses with Prescriptive Authority. (January 2021)
- Chapter 223. Fees. (October 2019)
- Chapter 224. Delegation of Nursing Tasks by Registered Professional Nurses to Unlicensed Personnel for Clients with Acute Conditions or in Acute Care Environments. (October 2019)
- Chapter 225. RN Delegation to Unlicensed Personnel and Tasks Not Requiring Delegation in Independent Living Environments for Clients With Stable and Predictable Conditions. (October 2019)

As a result of its review, the Texas Board of Nursing will readopt, re-adopt with amendments, or repeal rules following its assessment of whether the reasons for initially adopting the rules continue to exist.
