



The Next Generation NCLEX



On April 1, 2023, a new group of questions will be included in the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX), a nationwide examination for the initial licensing of licensed vocational nurses (LVNs) and registered nurses (RNs) for entry into nursing practice and will be known as the Next Generation (NGN) NCLEX questions. These are the product of over 10 years of preparation and research based upon findings from the LVN and RN Practice Analysis Surveys indicating that new nurses are engaged in nursing decision-making in their entry-level practice. The NGN questions have proven to evaluate the nurse's competence in six steps of the Clinical Judgment Measurement Model. The six steps in the decision-making model

are: recognizing (patient) cues, analyzing cues, prioritizing hypotheses, generating solutions, taking actions, and evaluating outcomes. The process in decision making is not linear but circular and dynamic. These six steps can be compared to the nursing process but focus more on the nurse's judgment in directing his/her practice. Nurses have been making critical decisions all along, but this model and the NGN questions provide a way to measure their abilities and to highlight nurses' skills. Only a portion of the NCLEX examination will consist of the NGN questions and the remaining portion of the exam will continue to use the reliable questions on the traditional exam.

Nursing programs have been advised of these changes in the exam for several years and have placed more emphasis on critical thinking and nursing judgment in the curricula. Nursing education textbooks and vendors have received extensive preparation from National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) NCLEX staff and most programs have taken advantage of suggested teaching and testing strategies in their education of nursing students.

- Employment Verifications

Please note: The APRN licensing department does not utilize the Message Center. Therefore, all communications and documents intended for, or related to, initial APRN licensure or APRN licensure by endorsement, must be emailed to APRN@bon.texas.gov.

Please allow Licensing Department staff **at least 10 business days** to review your message and respond. It is important that you **only send 1 message** related to your inquiry. Sending multiple messages about the same question(s) will delay response times.

The Texas Board of Nursing

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Summary of Actions



A regular meeting of the Board of Nursing was held July 21, 2022, in Austin. The following is a summary of Board actions taken during this meeting.

In the **August 5, 2022**, edition of the *Texas Register*:

The Board of Nursing (BON or Board) adopted new §211.11, relating to *Employee Leave Pools*, without changes to the proposed text published in the June 17, 2022, edition of the *Texas Register* (47 TexReg 3524). The new section is being adopted under the authority of the Government Code Chapter 661 and is necessary to implement the statutory requirements of that chapter. Pursuant to §661.002(a), the governing body of a state agency, through the establishment of a program, must allow an agency employee to voluntarily transfer to a sick leave pool sick leave earned by the employee. Adopted new §211.11(a) establishes the Board's sick leave pool pursuant to these statutory directives. The effective date for new §211.11 was August 8, 2022.

In the **August 19, 2022**, edition of the *Texas Register*:

The BON proposed amendments to §213.28, relating to *Licensure of Individuals with Criminal History*. The amendments are necessary to implement the statutory requirements of House Bill (HB) 1899, enacted by the 86th Texas Legislature, effective September 1, 2019. Pursuant to passage of HB 1899, the Board is required to deny or revoke the license of an individual who: (1) is required to register as a sex offender under the Code of Criminal Procedure Chapter 62; (2) has been previously convicted of or placed on deferred adjudication community supervision for the commission of a felony offense involv-

ing the use or threat of force; or (3) has been previously convicted of or placed on deferred adjudication community supervision for the commission of an offense: under the Penal Code §§22.011, 22.02, 22.021, or 22.04, or an offense under the laws of another state or federal law that is equivalent to an offense under one of those sections, committed in the course of providing services within the scope of the individual's license and in which the victim of the offense was a patient of the individual. SB 1899 also simultaneously amended the Code of Criminal Procedure Article 42.0175 to require affirmative findings to be included in criminal judgments regarding whether an individual is required to register as a sex offender under Chapter 62; whether an individual used force or threat of force in the commission of the offense; and whether the victim of the offense was a patient of the individual and the offense was committed in the course of providing services within the scope of the individual's license. HB 1899 also requires agencies like the Board to be notified of these disqualifying events by criminal trial courts and parole panels.

The Board also proposed amendments to §217.2, relating to *Licensure by Examination for Graduates of Nursing Education Programs Within the United States, its Territories, or Possessions*. The proposed amendments make non-substantive, editorial changes to the section and correct typographical errors.

The BON also proposed amendments to §217.5, relating to *Temporary License and Endorsement*. The amendments are necessary to clarify the Board's existing educational requirements for endorse-

ment applicants who graduated from an out of state nursing education program. The proposed amendments to §217.5 are necessary to clarify that the amendments previously adopted by the BON in February 2018 apply not only to applicants for initial licensure by examination, but also to applicants for initial licensure by endorsement. Initial licensure in Texas may occur either through examination by successfully passing the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN®) or National Council Licensure Examination for Practical/Licensed Vocational Nurses (NCLEX-PN®) or through endorsement of a nursing license issued from another state. When the Board originally adopted the rules regarding substantially equivalent education standards in February 2018, they were placed in §217.2. Section 217.2 contains the Board's requirements that generally apply to initial licensure by examination. Section 217.5 contains the requirements that generally apply to initial licensure by endorsement. Even though the amendments that were adopted in February 2018 also apply to applicants for initial licensure by endorsement, they were not also placed in §217.5 when the Board originally adopted them in 2018. The proposed amendments, therefore, place those requirements in §217.5 to provide additional clarity and congruency among the Board's rules.

The Board also proposed amendments to §221.12, relating to *Scope of Practice*. The amendments are necessary to clarify the scope of practice for advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs).

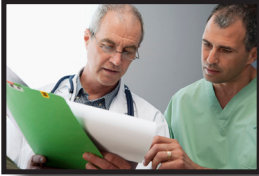

A New Model for Clinical Instruction

In March 2020, as the effects of the pandemic were beginning to be felt, the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) issued a Policy Brief¹ as a collaborative effort with major national nursing organizations in support of a clinical teaching model that allows nursing students to engage in hands-on patient care as a part of the nursing staff of a facility while meeting the clinical objectives for their nursing education. Certain key points are required to maintain compliance with Texas Board of Nursing rules and maximize the benefits to all involved:

- The establishment of an agreement between the practice and educational settings acknowledging responsibilities of each.
- The plan must assure faculty supervision and oversight whether faculty are present or supervision is through the preceptor model in Board rules.
- Students have received the appropriate didactic content for the clinical expectations and have demonstrated required skills.
- Scheduling shall consider class and

study responsibilities of students in this model.

- As a student in an approved nursing program, students may perform nursing activities within the normal student role (which are beyond those of unlicensed personnel).

Recognized benefits of this model:

- Students can gain real-life experiences in a clinical setting and are better prepared to transition to practice following graduation.
- The model allows students to be “essential workers” and continue their clinical education in times of emergency.
- The experience may be paid or not paid. There are no restrictions for students in this role from receiving wages.
- Students can be in the clinical setting for varying lengths of times, not restricted to a set clinical setting for a student group.
- The model provides more hands-on care providers at a time of nursing shortage.

- Students identify as a part of the team with a greater sense of accountability.
- The opportunity may offer a job possibility for the future.

Reminders:

- These are students and they have responsibilities for their educational demands.
- Students need to be evaluated against clinical expectations and competency levels.
- Preceptors should receive orientation and guidance from the program.
- Ongoing communication between education and practice is vital.

88th Texas Legislative Session Begins in January: Free Resources

Available for Monitoring the Session



In Rule 217.11.(1)(A) relating to *Standards of Nursing Practice*, the Texas Board of Nursing (Board) sets out its expectations that nurses have a responsibility to know and conform to not only the Nursing Practice Act and Board's Rules, but all rules and regulations that originate as federal, state, or local laws. On January 10, 2023, the 88th Texas Legislative Session begins. Bill filing in the House of Representatives will continue until March 10th although the Senate can file bills at any time during the session. The regular session will continue through May 29th. Laws passed by the Legislature can impact nursing practice in a variety of ways. Laws passed during the Texas Legislative Session can affect the way you obtain your education, your license, or what you may do during your nursing practice. The Board is not a source for information pertaining to the status or progress of bills or political issues associated with legislation. You can obtain information about proposed and enacted laws and rules that pertain to nursing practice by visiting one of several websites. Some free sites available include:

State Legislation

The State of Texas has a few informative websites for looking at pending or passed legislation. A good place to start your search is the site **Texas Legislature Online** located at www.capitol.state.tx.us/. This site also links to the Texas Senate and House of Representatives. You can enter a word or phrase in the search menu and pull up bills containing those words. You can also go through search matches and check the status, history, or language of those bills. Previous legislative sessions may also be accessed through this site.

Texas Register

The *Board of Nursing Bulletin* often mentions the *Texas Register* as the publication where nurses can read about proposed rule changes or new rules that have been adopted by state agencies. The website for the *Texas Register* is www.sos.state.tx.us/texreg/index.html. The *Texas Register* is updated on a weekly basis by the Office of the Secretary of State.

Federal Legislation

One of the best resources for checking on legislation in the U.S. House of Representatives or U.S. Senate is **Congress.gov** which is located at <https://www.congress.gov/>. You can enter a word or phrase in the search window for a list of bills containing those key words or go straight to a specific House or Senate bill. You can also read the full text of the bill to see its relevance to your practice or check the bill's status within the legislative process.

Other Web Resources

Professional organizations and associations are very active during the legislative session monitoring, providing responses, and proposing legislation. They frequently have websites that offer updates on legislation affecting nursing.

Student Loan Forgiveness for Nurses

What is student loan forgiveness for nurses?

Student loan forgiveness is the opportunity for borrowers who become nurses to have their federal loans discharged through national or state programs.

To qualify for loan forgiveness programs, you will need to meet specific requirements depending on which program you choose. It is important to research and understand the requirements before committing. Typically, loan forgiveness programs require that you fulfill certain work obligations for a period of time before your loans will be forgiven.

The following are options at the state and national level to consider for student loan forgiveness.

National Programs

Below are national programs that nurses across the country can access. These programs vary on the type of work you do or on the type of student loans you have.

- **Army Nurse Corps**
- **Faculty Loan Repayment Program**
- **Federal Perkins loan cancellation**
- **Indian Health Service (IHS) Loan Repayment Program (LRP)**
- **National Health Service Corps (NHSC) Loan Repayment Program (LRP)**
- **NHSC Substance Use Disorder Workforce**
- **NHSC Rural Community LRP**

- **Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program**
- **Public Service Loan Forgiveness Program (PSLF)**

Texas Rural Communities Health Care Investment Program

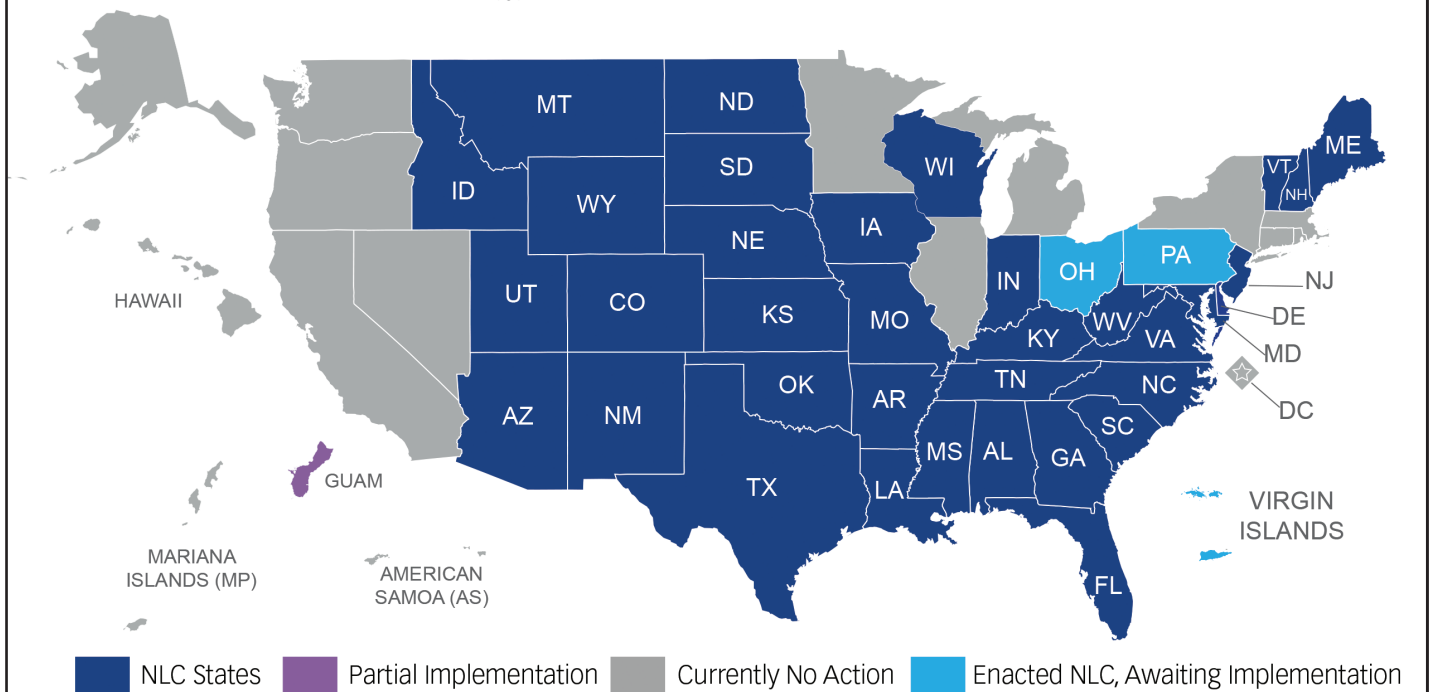
In Texas, the Rural Communities Health Care Investment Program offers loan reimbursements to health care providers who are not physicians. Eligible candidates must commit to working at least 12 months to be able to receive awards up to \$10,000.

MOVING FROM...

Noncompact → Compact:

The nurse is responsible for applying for licensure by endorsement in the new state of residence. The nurse may apply before or after the move. A multistate license may be issued if residency and eligibility requirements are met. If the nurse holds a single state license issued by the noncompact state, it is not affected.

Compact → Noncompact:

The nurse is responsible for applying for licensure by endorsement in the new state of residence. The nurse may apply before or after the move. The multistate license of the former NLC state is changed to a single state license upon changing legal residency to a noncompact state. The nurse is responsible for notifying the board of nursing (BON) of the former NLC state of the new address.

Compact → Compact:

When moving (changing primary state of legal residence) to a new NLC state, it is the nurse's responsibility to apply for licensure by endorsement. This should be completed upon moving and the nurse should not delay. There is no grace period. The nurse may not wait until the former license expires to apply in the nurse's new state of legal residency. The nurse may practice on the former home state license only UNTIL the multistate license in the new NLC home state is issued. Proof of residency such as a driver's license may be required. Upon issuance of a new multistate license, the former license is inactivated.

Another Country (International Nurses)

If a nurse on a visa from another country applies for licensure in a compact state, the nurse is responsible for either declaring the country of origin or the compact state as their primary state of residency. If the foreign country is declared the primary state of residency, the nurse may be eligible for a single state license issued by the compact state.

Definition:

Primary State of Residence (PSOR):

The state (also known as the home state) in which a nurse declares a primary residence for legal purposes. Sources used to verify a nurse's primary residence may include driver's license, federal income tax return or voter registration. PSOR refers to legal residency status and does not pertain to home or property ownership. Only one state can be identified as the primary state of legal residence for NLC purposes.

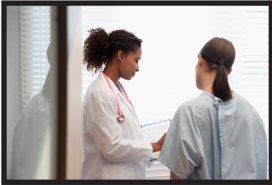
* More than two-thirds of survey takers indicated that they have never accessed the site. Among those who did access the page, the highest percentage (12.82%) access the page once or twice a year.

Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs): Medical or Nursing Peer Review?



Advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs) hold licensure to practice as registered nurses (RNs) as well as their advanced practice licensure. The advanced practice license is linked to the RN license and cannot be issued without RN licensure. Therefore, APRN nursing practice issues are peer reviewed through the nursing rather than medical peer review process. Although APRNs are often reviewed for credentialing and privileging by the medical executive committee or medical credentialing committee, it is not appropriate for a medical peer review committee to carry out either incident-based or safe harbor nursing peer review for advanced practice registered nurses. This requirement for nursing peer review instead of medical peer review, relates to the intent of the two types of peer review. Keep in mind, the Texas Board of Nursing (Board) regulates the licensure and practice of APRNs and therefore the Nursing Practice Act and Nursing Peer Review laws and rules govern an APRN's practice. With nursing peer review, the intent is to determine if there is a deficiency in the nurse's practice and if so, whether that incident qualifies as a minor incident, which can be remediated internally, or if it requires a mandatory report to the Board.

Section 303.003 of the nursing peer review law specifies the composition requirements of a nursing peer review committee. Nurses must comprise 3/4

of the committee. Again, since APRNs hold licensure to practice as RNs as well as their advanced practice licensure, when the individual whose practice is under review is licensed as an RN (and APRN), 2/3 of the committee must be composed of RNs and/or APRNs, and only the RN and/or APRN committee members may vote. To the extent feasible, the committee shall include at least one nurse who is familiar with the practice area. Other individuals can be on the committee, but only the RNs (including APRNs) will vote, since they know the scope and practice laws and rules, and standards related to nursing practice.

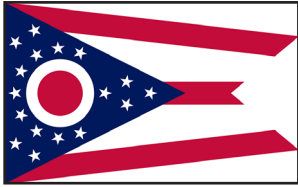
Then what are some options for determining which nurses should comprise the nursing peer review committee to review an APRN's nursing practice?

There is nothing in the law that says a single employer cannot have multiple peer review committees. If it is feasible to do so, an employer could elect to establish a separate committee composed of a majority of APRNs to peer review advanced practice nursing issues. This committee could be separate from the peer review committee that reviews RN and/or LVN practice issues.

If multiple peer review committees are not an option for an employer, it is also possible to invite an APRN who practices

in the same or similar role and population focus area to serve as a resource to the committee when an APRN's practice is reviewed. If asked to participate in the nursing peer review as a resource on APRN practice, and not as a committee member, the resource APRN would not vote. This APRN would serve to provide education regarding the standard of care, information regarding diagnosis and medical management practices, and could offer comment regarding the individual's practice. The resource APRN could be employed by the same employer or could be contracted from outside the employment setting; however, the resource APRN would be bound by the same confidentiality provisions as committee members. For example, if a family nurse practitioner (FNP) is being reviewed in a small facility, there may not be another APRN who is an FNP to serve on the nursing peer review committee. In this case, the committee may consist of mainly RNs and an APRN who is licensed in a different population focus area (for example, a Women's Health Nurse Practitioner), all of which are employed by the facility and are familiar with its culture, policies, and procedures. In addition, the employer can then contract for the services of an FNP to provide the committee with the perspective of the FNP role and functions.

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Ohio to Implement Nurse Licensure Compact in January 2023

On January 1, 2023, Ohio will officially implement the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC). If a nurse holds an Ohio single state license, to obtain an Ohio multistate license, starting January 1, 2023, he/she will complete the “Multistate Conversion” application on the Ohio Board of Nursing (BON) website. That means that the current Ohio single state license held by the nurse will be converted to an Ohio multistate license, if eligibility requirements are met. If a nurse does not already hold an Ohio license, to obtain an Ohio multistate license, starting January 1, 2023, he/she will complete the “Reciprocity” (also known as endorsement) application on the Ohio BON website (nursing.ohio.gov). He/she will be issued an Ohio multistate license, if eligibility requirements are met. When nurses hold a multistate license in their primary state of residence, they do not need to hold any single state licenses in any other NLC states, which is a cost savings for nurses.

Summary of Actions

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At its regularly scheduled October 2021 Board meeting, the BON charged the Advanced Practice Nursing Advisory Committee (Committee) with reviewing §221.12 and recommending any necessary changes. The Board issued this charge to the Committee based upon an increased number of questions and complaints from the public regarding certain procedures and patient care activities being performed by APRNs. The Committee convened on March 3, 2022, and June 13, 2022, to consider the BON’s charge. The Board considered the Committee’s recommendations for amendments to §221.12 at its July 2022, regularly scheduled Board meeting and voted to propose the amendments in the *Texas Register* for public comment.

The earliest possible date of adoption for proposed amendments to §213.28, §217.2, and §221.12 is September 18, 2022.

In other circumstances, when an APRN’s nursing practice is under review, it may be prudent to have a physician serve as a resource regarding medical management and medical plans of care. Nothing in the law prohibits physicians from being involved with the nursing peer review committee as experts or fact witnesses. However, they are prohibited from being voting members when nursing (including advanced practice nursing) practice is reviewed, again due to the primary intent of nursing peer review.

Katelyn Dian O'Rear



Between June 29, 2021, and January 28, 2022, Katelyn Dian O'Rear gained employment with a home health agency in Sherman, Texas, using the registered nurse (RN) license number belonging to another licensee and provided direct patient care while representing herself as an RN to staff, patients, physicians, and the general public. Although Katelyn Dian O'Rear had been issued her own RN license, that license had been suspended under the terms of a Board Order. This case has been referred to the Grayson County District Attorney's Office for prosecution.

Did you know. . . As of September 1, 2019, prescribers are limited to issuing prescriptions for controlled substances for acute pain for up to a ten-day supply only. House Bill 2174, passed in the 86th Regular Texas Legislative Session, added this requirement to Texas law.

TPAPN Fall Educational Opportunities

The Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN) safeguards patients by providing early identification, support, monitoring, accountability, and advocacy to Texas nurses who have an identified substance use or mental health condition or related incident, so they may practice nursing safely. If you would like more information about the TPAPN program, TPAPN is offering a *TPAPN Lunch and Learn* session on December 7, 2022.

The Peer Support Partner is a volunteer nurse who provides peer support, guidance, encouragement, and more, to nurses participating in TPAPN. *Peer Support Partner Informational Sessions* are currently offered monthly by TPAPN so you can learn more about the fundamental role of the Peer Support Partner. The next information

sessions are scheduled for: October 18, 2022; November 15, 2022; and December 13, 2022.

To become a Peer Support Partner, attendance is required at a *Peer Support Partner Workshop*. The *Peer Support Partner Workshop* is designed to provide information about substance use disorder and mental health in nursing as well as information regarding peer support and is offered several times a year. The next date for the *Peer Support Partner Workshop* is October 28, 2022.

Current Peer Support Partners are supported in part through monthly Peer Support Partner educational groups. The monthly *Peer Support Partner Educational Group* will meet

on October 20, 2022; November 17, 2022; and December 16, 2022.

The TPAPN website has more information about the program, Peer Support Partners, and registration links for the various education and training opportunities; please visit www.tpapn.org. A nurse with issues related to substance use or mental health conditions that might impact nursing practice may self-report to TPAPN. A person may report a nurse to TPAPN when aware of a nurse with a substance use or mental health condition when the nurse has not had a nursing practice violation. The TPAPN referral form is on the TPAPN website. A nurse who has committed a practice violation and is impaired or suspected of being impaired must be reported to the Board of Nursing.
